Advanced City, Open to the World

Busan, a bustling city of approximately 3.6 million residents, is located on the south-eastern tip of the Korean peninsula. The natural environment of Busan is a perfect example of harmony between mountains, rivers and sea. Its geography includes a coastline with superb beaches and scenic cliffs, mountains which provide excellent hiking and extraordinary views, and hot springs scattered throughout the city. Busan enjoys four distinct seasons and a temperate climate that never gets too hot or too cold. Busan is the second largest city in Korea. Its deep harbor and gentle tides have allowed it to grow into the largest container handling port in the country and the fifth largest in the world. The city's natural surroundings and rich history have resulted in Busan's increasing reputation as a world class city of tourism and culture, and it is also becoming renowned as an international convention destination.





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PUKYONG NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Located in the most beautiful and dynamic city in Korea, Pukyong National University is surrounded by lively and exciting culture

Pukyong National University (PKNU) is one of the most prestigious national universities in Korea, PKNU was founded in 1996 after Busan National University of Fisheries (est. 1941) and Busan National University of Technology (est. 1924) merged. Having more than 26,000 students, PKNU is one of the ten large-scale national universities in Korea. With approval of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN, PKNU, top university in the field of Marine and fisheries Science and Research in Korea, has been nominated by the FAO in April 2016 as World Fisheries University's location, and PKNU currently takes the responsibility of the Pilot Program of graduate degree which starts up in 2017.

The university has developed academic partnerships with over 200 universities and institutions from around the world. More than 1,000 international students from 65 different countries are currently participating in PKNU's undergraduate and graduate programs.

OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

The Office of International Affairs (OIA) is a gateway to lead Pukyong to the world!

Consisting of Division of International Relations, Division of International Student Services and Global Language Learning Center, the OIA of PKNU is nurturing global talents with a cosmopolitan outlook on the back of creative research, education and globalization programs.

The Office fulfills such important functions as establishment of Infrastructure for International academic exchange, operation of internationalization programs, support for admission and management of foreign students, and Korean education program, so that PKNU students, faculties and staffs could pursue their quest for international for international knowledge and experience.

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PKNU offers a program for international students who wish to join our university's regular courses on the main campus! A wide range of courses are offered in English by individual colleges and departments. The list of courses taught in English will be available in the middle of January for the following spring semester and in July for the following fall semester. In addition, this list will be sent to all accepted exchange students by e-mail with instructions on course registration.

Exchange students are allowed to pursue their studies at PKNU for one or two semesters as non-degree seeking students and the credits successfully earned at PKNU would be awarded as their home university's credits according to the home university's policy.

During your exchange period, you can gain not only academic credits but also Korean workplace experience! PKNU provides international students with opportunities to integrate into the Korean workplace through internships in a diverse range of occupations, including our university, local government and Korean companies. Those who wish to participate in the internship should indicate their intention of participating in the internship program when applying for exchange student program to Pukyong National University. The internship placement assignments of the internship institutions will vary according to the participants' major and language ability in Korean. Note that disadvantages are cost – for most interns, internship may be unpaid - and sometimes unpredictability of placement.

Since 2001, PKNU has run the Korean Language Training course for thousands of international students from different countries. In this program, students can cultivate their Korean language ability through organized Korean language classes on a beautiful campus which is located close to Haeundae and Gwangali beaches.

How to apply

- **Step 1.** Ask for information about program entrance from the Division of International Student Services, PKNU.
- **Step 2.** Arrange application documents
- Step 3. Application should be submitted either in person or via email.

Standards for application

- Type A. People who need a new language training visa in Korea (D-4)
 Foreigners (or Koreans with foreign citizenships) who have either have completed a domestic or international high school course or have equivalent academic ability.
- Type B. People who extend a language training visa in Korea (D-4)
 Foreigners staying in Korea who need to change their visas to D4 or transfer students from other Korean language institutes in Korea.
- Type C. People who any other type of visa in Korea (except D-4)
 Foreigners (or Korean national abroad citizens) who have a visa to stay in Korea for more than 90 days.
