Exchange Program Fact Sheet 2020-2021

1. Application Schedule

Semester	Application Period & Deadline	Official Semester Period Including summer/spring break *1	Official Lecture Period *Including final exam week
1st	Mid Aug.– Nov. 1	Apr. 1 – Sep. 30	Apr. 1 - early Aug.
2nd	Mid Feb. – May 1	Oct. 1 – Mar. 31	Oct. 1 - early Feb.

*1 Applying students must stay enrolled in their home universities throughout this period. Students who will graduate earlier than this period are not eligible to apply. SRS students do not need to follow the above semester schedule, but they must stay enrolled throughout the whole setting period.

2. Academic Information

1) Programs

We offer two different exchange programs: Special Audit Student (SAS) and Special Research Student (SRS) . Student can apply for one of the programs.



<Eligibility> Graduate students and Undergraduate Students
 <What Students Do> Take courses and earn credits
 <Exchange Period> 1 or 2 semesters
 <Note> Students are required to attend courses at least 10 hours a week (7 courses)



<Eligibility> Graduate students only
 <What Students Do> Undertakes research relating to specialized area and receive supervision for research
 <Exchange Period> On a monthly basis, up to 1 year
 <Note> SRS are not eligible to take courses

<IMPORTANT NOTICE>

- 1) Due to the increasing number of students and limits in space, sometimes not all applicants can be accepted.
- 2) Although there's no cut off score, we require applicants to submit the Japanese or English score. For undergraduate student, applicants are recommended to have at least N2 level Japanese proficiency since most courses are offered in Japanese. - 3) It is our policy not to communicate directly with a student until they are officially accepted. Please advise your students to inquire with us from the representative person of the home university.

2) Field of Study

We have 4 different departments for undergraduate level students and 13 different divisions for graduate school level students

3) Courses

SAS can find courses from the link below. They are required to pre-register for courses at the time of application. They can change courses only if there are unavoidable circumstances.

4) Transcripts

We send transcripts of SAS after their last semester in HU (After Oct. 1 for the 1st semester and Apr. 1 for the 2nd semester) . Students who study for two semesters can request their transcripts of the first semester while they are enrolled in HU.

5) Japanese Courses

We offer General Japanese classes for exchange students at Institute for the Advancement of Higher Education. The classes are free, and no credits will be issued. The course will be offered at three levels: Introductory, Intermediate and Advanced. Please see below for more information.

3. Visa

Accepted international students are required to obtain a visa to study in Japan. After students' admission has been approved, Hokkaido University applies for the Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) which is a required document for student visa application. It will be sent to partner universities with their official acceptance letter. Students will then complete the required procedures to apply for the visa at the nearest embassy/consulate-general of Japan located in their home country.

4. Campus Life

1) Insurance <IMPORTANT!!>

<A. Health Insurance>

All students must be enrolled in Japanese National Health Insurance (NHI) after arrival. They only need to pay 30% of total medical fees when they visit doctors with NHI.

<B. Personal Accident Insurance and Liability Insurance >

All students must be enrolled in the insurances that cover personal injuries, injuries to a third party or damaging any property belonging to a third party as a result of an unexpected accident during educational and research activities. We ask students to either buy the insurances in Japan (JPY 1,340 up to 1yr) or submit a copy of such insurance policy which students are enrolled in their home countries.

2) Residence Life

Students are eligible to apply for university dormitories. Accepted students can apply for several dormitories and they are allocated to each room in a lottery. Dormitory open day is Mar. 25 for the 1st semester and Sep.25 for the 2nd semester and close day is Sep.17 and Mar. 17 respectively. (Students who will study for two semesters can stay in the same room during the closure period between the semesters. Please see below for more information.
