SEMESTER DATES FOR GLOBAL JAPAN PROGRAM	[Spring semester] from mid-April to mid-July (14 weeks) [Fall semester] from mid-September to mid-December (14 weeks) *Exchange students should arrive about 1 - 2 weeks before the beginning of the program. Arrival dates and orientation dates are included in the acceptance package. If students need self-quarantine to prevent COVID-19 infection, they are required to come to Japan earlier.
SEMESTER DATES FOR STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM	[Spring semester] from mid-April to end-July (15 weeks) [Fall semester] from mid-September to mid-January (15 weeks) *New Year Holidays: the last week of December and the first week of January *Exchange students should arrive about 1 - 2 weeks before the beginning of the program. Arrival dates and orientation dates are included in the acceptance package. If students need self-quarantine to prevent COVID-19 infection, they are required to come to Japan earlier.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS	<u>Global Japan Program</u> Do not require any Japanese language proficiency – NUFS offers Japanese language education on various levels from the absolute beginner to the advanced. Students wishing to register for the GJSC classes must be proficient in English. <u>Study Abroad at NUFS Undergraduate and Graduate Schools</u> Undergraduate - JLPT N2 level, Graduate School - JLPT N1 level

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS AND CREDIT TRANSFERS	In accordance with the Immigration Bureau regulations, students in all three programs are required to enroll in at least seven classroom (contact) hours per week (there is no minimum credit requirement). Each classroom hour is 90 minutes. One NUFS credit translates to 1.5 credits in the ECTS system. For each contact hour, 1 or 2 NUFS credits/semester (1.5 or 3 ECTS credits/semester) are awarded.

ACCOMMODATION	<p>It is mandatory for all the exchange students to live in our dormitories. All dormitories are single room with a private bathroom. We have three dormitories (NUFS International House, NUFS Global Village and NUFS-NUAS Residence) within walking distance from the university. STUDENT VISA	Exchange students are required to obtain a student visa prior to their arrival in Japan. After receiving all application documents from a student, NUFS will apply to the Immigration Bureau for the Certificate of Eligibility (CoE). Once the CoE has been issued and delivered to NUFS, it will be sent to the student's home institution by express airmail (DHL or EMS). After receiving the CoE, the students will need to apply for their student visa at a Japanese embassy/consulate nearest to their place of residence. The student visa cannot be issued in Japan.
TRAVEL AND HEALTH INSURANCE	<p>Students need to obtain an overseas travel and health insurance policy (which covers for entire period of stay in Japan) in their home country. In addition, students need to obtain the National Health Insurance policy in Japan after arrival. This insurance premium is approximately ¥2,000 per month.</p>

<p>ARRIVING IN NAGOYA FROM OVERSEAS</p>	<p>NUFS is located in the outskirts of Nagoya, Japan's fourth largest metropolis with a major international airport – Central Japan International Airport “Centrair” (NGO). However, Centrair services fewer direct flights to and from Europe and North America than other major international airports in Japan, so depending on where the student lives, it may be easier to arrive in Japan at Tokyo's Haneda (HND) or Narita (NRT) international airports or Kansai International Airport (KIX) in Osaka.</p>
<p>GETTING TO NUFS</p>	<p><u>Upon arrival at Centrair -Central Japan International Airport-:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Board the airport bus from Centrair to Fujigaoka station and from there you can catch a taxi to NUFS.
