Admission procedures for foreign students coming to the ENSA-PB

Conditions of admission	<p>We recommend that students integrate the ENSA-PB at the beginning of the first semester in September.</p> <p>Students generally come for the second or third year of study (Bachelor's Degree) or for the first year of the Master's degree. Though it is also possible to come for the fifth year of study (second year of the Master's degree). <i>(Students may come for the fifth year of study; in this case they are required to take courses in the Master 1 program).</i></p> <p>In all cases, students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered. Their course of study should be compatible with the structure of the ENSA-PB program in which they are enrolled.</p> <p>ENSA-PB will only accept students with at least an intermediate level in French (B1).</p>
Application deadline	The application deadline is April, 24th 2020 for the first semester and November, 6th 2020 for the second semester.
Application procedure	<p>The ENSA-PB only accepts applications sent over e-mail by the International Office of the student's home university.</p> <p>The registrations are made online</p> <p>A certificate of admission will be sent to the student.</p>

Language and language courses	All classes are taught in French. Intensive French courses take place in September. French courses are proposed all year round. They are free and organized by the school.
Academic calendar	The academic year, divided in two semesters, lasts 10 months. It runs from late September to mid-July, with a two-week break in December, a one-week break in February, and another two-week break in April.
Pédagogical registration	A course registration form is available before the beginning of each semester; the students will be asked to classify studio and course choices in order of preference. The school cannot necessarily honor the first or second choice. Students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered. Their course of study must be compatible with the structure of the ENSA-PB program in which they are enrolled. Learning agreement (for Erasmus+ students only)	A draft version of the learning agreement for 2020-2021 will be established before the student arrives. The learning agreement will be finalized once the final pedagogical registration is completed.

Health insurance and civil liability Insurance	Health insurance Ø Students that are European Union citizens will send a copy of their valid, up-to-date European social security card. Ø Students that are NON-European Union citizens will have to register on the web site https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/ Civil liability Insurance Each student <u>is required</u> to have a civil liability insurance valid in France, which covers the damage he or she might cause to others. This insurance can be purchased in France at a cost of about 15 euros.
